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About ArcelorMittal

ArcelorMittal is one of the world's leading integrated steel and mining companies, with 126,756 employees of 142 nationalities in more than 60 countries, and steelmaking operations in 15 countries.

ArcelorMittal is the leader in all major global steel markets including automotive, construction, household appliances, and packaging, with world-class research and development and outstanding distribution networks.

ArcelorMittal values geographical breadth, product diversity and raw-material security.

In 2023, approximately **39%** of its crude steel was produced in the Americas, approximately **50%** was produced in Europe and approximately **11%** was produced in other countries, such as South Africa and Ukraine.

At ArcelorMittal, our goal is to help build a better world by developing smarter steels for people and planet. Since the company was founded, we have aimed to align all of our activity against four values: safety, sustainability, quality, and leadership.

Each of these values stands on a foundation of health & safety.

Smarter steels for people and planet



Climate action

Our journey towards becoming carbon neutral by 2050 is well underway. In line with the Paris Climate Goals and the European Green Deal, ArcelorMittal has also committed to reduce CO_2 emissions in our European operations by 35% by 2030.

As Europe's largest steelmaker, ArcelorMittal has a significant role to play in enhancing the sustainability of our industry. Our decarbonisation strategy has three main levers: Circular steel, Innovative Direct Reduced Iron (DRI), and Smart Carbon steelmaking. Projects are underway for all three levers to ensure we achieve our goals on schedule.

Our XCarb® initiative groups together all of ArcelorMittal's low-carbon steelmaking activities, projects, and products. Our industry-first XCarb® green steel certificates are the result of decarbonisation efforts upstream of the blast furnace operations. They allow customers to reduce their Scope 3 emissions. XCarb® recycled and renewably produced is a brand applied to steels produced in ArcelorMittal's electric arc furnaces (EAFs) using renewable electricity and up to 100% scrap content.

> In 2023, we continued to work on our Smart Carbon and Innovative DRI initiatives. Significant progress has been made in our Torero and Steelanol projects as part of these initiatives.

What we do

ArcelorMittal Europe – Flat Products is the largest producer of flat steel in Europe. The business produces hot and cold rolled coils, coated products, tinplate, plate, hot dip galvanised products, and enamelled and electrical steels.

Flat Products has 11 integrated and mini-mill sites, and primary facilities in five countries. It sells to a wide range of industries including packaging, general industry (civil engineering, construction, domestic appliances, oil & gas, renewable energies, yellow & green goods), and automotive. ArcelorMittal's advanced high strength steel (AHSS) and electrical steel solutions are helping car manufacturers on the road to e-mobility.

ArcelorMittal Europe – Long Products operates 27 production sites in ten countries and is a leader in the manufacture of sections, sheet piles, rails, quality wire rod, rebars, and bars.

Sections and Merchant bars offers the widest selection of sections – from small to jumbo.

Rails & Special Sections as a leading rail producer, offers a wide portfolio of solutions for railways, subways, tramways, light-rail tracks, crossings, crane rails and rail components. We are also able to provide other special products such as cathode bars, track shoes and mining sections.

Sheet Piling is the world leader in sheet piling technology, offering a complete foundation solution from the concept stage to project execution. Our offer includes accessories, engineering and design support, special fabrication and finishing, and just-in-time logistics support.

Bars and rods offers a wide selection of wire rod as well as special bar quality (SBQ), and forging billet. These products are used in a range of final applications. WireSolutions offers a diverse portfolio of low and high carbon wire products, including industrial wires, flat and shaped wires, cold heading quality wires, cold rolled wires, wire ropes, wire fencing, nails, and steel fibres for concrete reinforcement. Corrosion resistant product solutions are WireSolutions' particular expertise.

Steligence® is ArcelorMittal's unique, holistic, and commercial approach to the construction market. Steligence® offers customers a complete set of construction-related products, services, and solutions.

ArcelorMittal Downstream Solutions offers processing and distribution solutions for ArcelorMittal's automotive and industrial customers in Europe. As well as distributing flat and long products, ArcelorMittal Downstream Solutions offers value-added and customised steel solutions through **Steel Service Centres Europe**. Specific solutions are dispatched through other ArcelorMittal Downstream Solutions business lines. These include:

ArcelorMittal International: sells a full range of products via a network of offices located around the world.

ArcelorMittal Projects: provides complete, customised, and sustainable steel solutions and services via three specialised, project-related business lines: Foundation Solutions, Energy Projects, and Solar Projects.

Construction: transforms coils into finished products such as profiles, panels, and facade sidings for any kind of building.

Distribution Europe: provides a wide range of steel, stainless steel, aluminium, and building products to small local businesses, major industrial companies, and multinationals.

Industeel: with facilities in Belgium and France, Industeel produces special steel plates and forged blocks from carbon, low-alloy, and stainless steels in thicknesses ranging from 4 to 1,200 mm.

Tubular Products: one of the most diverse producers of pipes and tubes, servicing a range of markets including energy, construction, engineering, and automotive.

Recycling: with almost 20 yards in four European countries, this business division for scrap collection and recycling is becoming a strategic asset which will ensure the sustainable continuity of our steel operations in Europe.

ArcelorMittal Powders: the Group's first entry into the additive manufacturing market as a steel powder supplier. The company is building an industrialscale inert gas atomiser in Avilés (Spain), to produce AdamIQ[™] steel powders for additive technologies such as laser powder bed fusion, binder jetting, and direct energy deposition.

Alliance Green Services (AGS): provides specialised services to the steel industry, focused on innovation to create value, increase safety, and lower environmental impact. AGS, which operates in 8 countries, has the experience, technology, and commitment to bring change to an industry with increasing pressure on carbon footprint and valorisation of residual wastes.

Sustainability investments highlights

New, ongoing, & recently completed investments in Europe:

Europe

The Volteron[™] agreement between ArcelorMittal and John Cockerill will see the two companies define an industrial-scale facility to refine iron ore through electrolysis using renewable electricity.

ArcelorMittal is developing its scrap recycling and collection capabilities. The company has established around one million tonnes of steel scrap processing capability through acquisitions in the UK, Germany, and the Netherlands.

Belgium

ArcelorMittal Belgium has commissioned its Torero plant at the Gent steelmaking site. The plant converts waste wood into bio-coal using a process known as torrefaction. The first bio-coal made in the Torero plant was successfully used in the Gent blast furnace in December 2023.

Using Europe's first carbon capture and utilisation (CCU) project, ArcelorMittal Gent industrially produced ethanol in November 2023. This is a significant step in the journey to the full commissioning of the Steelanol plant.



Spain

Following its entry into the additive manufacturing (AdM) market as a steel powder supplier, ArcelorMittal is building an industrial-scale inert gas atomiser in Avilés. It will produce steel powders for AdM technologies such as laser powder bed fusion (LPBF), binder jetting (BJ), and direct energy deposition (DED).

The mill at Olaberria is revamping the re-heating furnace of the rolling mill. This will enable the mill to increase productivity while reducing gas consumption by 4% and CO₂ emissions by 4,000 tonnes annually.



ArcelorMittal Asturias has signed a contract with industrial engineering company Sarralle, to build a new electric arc furnace (EAF) in Gijón, as part of the company's decarbonisation plan for Spain. The improvements will allow Gijón to use much larger volumes of recycled material and less virgin material and coal. The production of steel in the new EAF plant will contribute to ArcelorMittal's target to achieve a 35% reduction in CO₂ emissions in Europe by 2030.

France

As a key lever for the decarbonisation of the site, ArcelorMittal Fos-sur-Mer's new ladle furnace will reduce the site's carbon footprint by almost 10%. This is a key step which will help ArcelorMittal Europe achieve its target of reducing emissions by 35% by 2030.



Germany

A second ladle furnace is being installed at ArcelorMittal Duisburg. This will increase the usage of scrap with a resulting reduction in CO₂ emissions.

A common project to replace oil- and coal-based heating stations in the Hamburg district is expected to begin in 2026 with other local industries. The project will also see the partners produce energy which will be used in their operations and the local community. This



will reduce CO_2 emissions for the district, recover waste energy, and achieve local synergies.

Luxembourg

ArcelorMittal has invested €67 million for upgrading its steel plant, including a new EAF at its site in Belval. The investment is supported by the Luxembourg Ministry of Economy. This revamped facility and EAF will offer improved energy efficiency and increase in steel production capacity by almost 15%. This will enable the mill to produce up to 2.5 million tonnes of steel per year.



Latest innovations

Our research teams make R&D the main driver of growth and a leading force for innovation within the ArcelorMittal group. Our latest innovations include:



Thanks to ArcelorMittal Multi Part Integration[™] (MPI) vehicles featuring hot stamped double door rings and H-frames are now on the roads, streamlining production processes and minimising both shopfloor and CO, footprint.



Helioroof, a ground-breaking solar roofing solution, is part of the EU-funded Helexio[®] Line project. The product offers a 25% reduction in CO_2 emissions compared to standard solar roofing solutions.



Amstrong^a Ultra 960MCL HE was specifically developed for the rough-terrain crane market. This sector is expected to grow massively due to the global energy transformation which is currently underway.





Optigal[®] and Magnelis[®] metallic coatings were rolled out at Avilés (Spain) and Montataire (France) sites and will be rolled out next at Krakow (Poland). Process adaptations have been made to support the ramp-up of chrome-free passivation.

An innovative head-hardened rail from ArcelorMittal Poland's rolling mill in Dąbrowa will improve railway safety.



By combining HyPer[®] high strength steels with our advanced Magnelis[®] coating, ArcelorMittal Europe has created a durable solution for long-lasting and lightweight solar structures. The material is also suitable for the foundations of these structures due to the extended heavy coating range.
